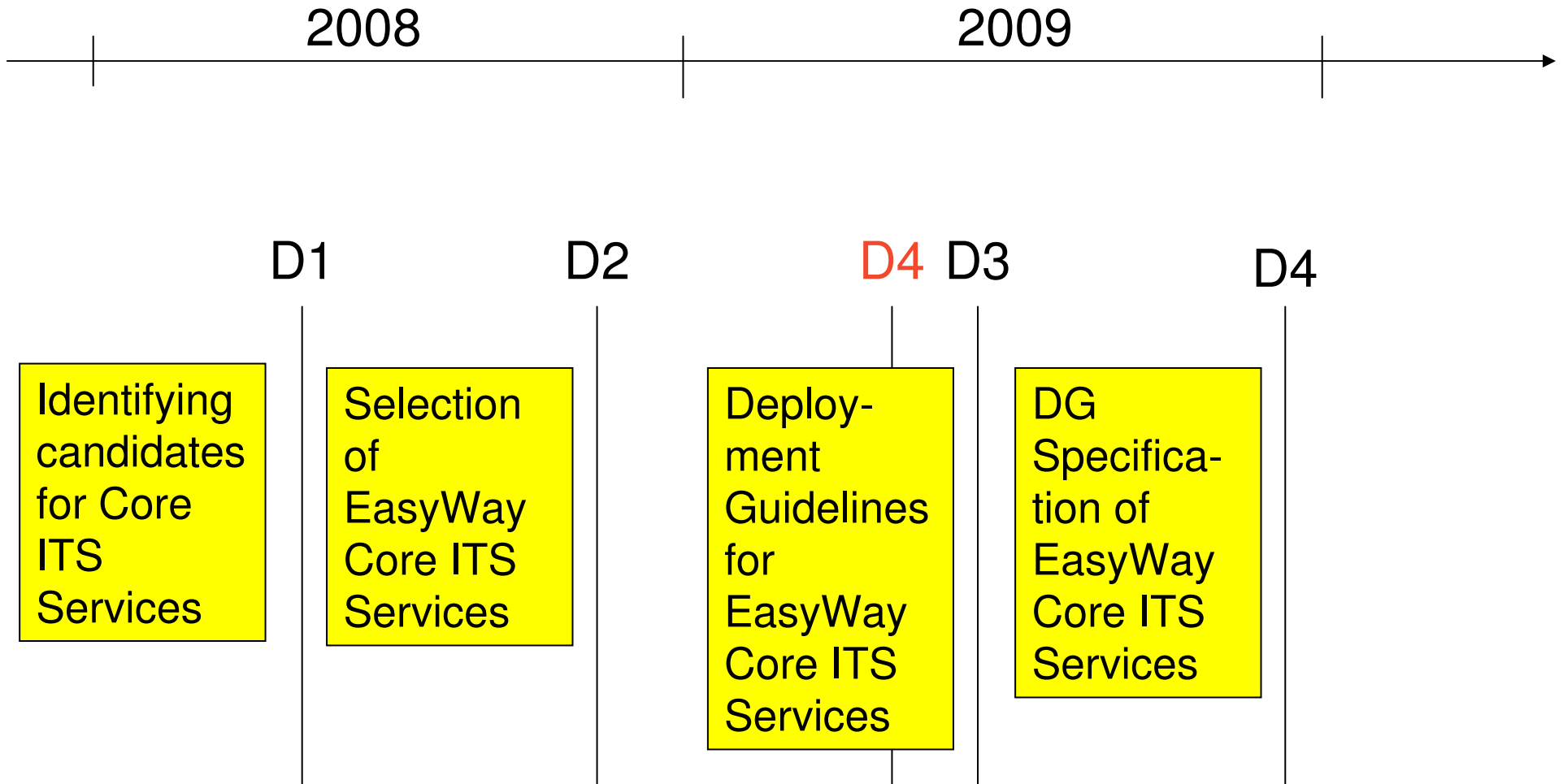

Definition of Core European ITS Services

- Core European ITS Services are services for European road users, where road operators play a key role in their implementation and operation
- **A Core European ITS service means:**
 - **The road users shall know when to expect it (operating environment)**
 - **It shall offer a minimum level of common content and functionality**
 - **It shall offer a common “look and feel” when relevant**
- Core European ITS Services are considered to be mature enough and effective enough (in relation to EasyWay objectives) to form the backbone of deployment activities within EasyWay.



The role of the Deployment Guidelines

- **The scope of EasyWay is the deployment of Core European Services. Hence, EasyWay activities aim at the implementation and development of these services**
- **The Deployment Guidelines are a tool to be used in EasyWay implementation activities.**
- **By using the Guidelines as the basis for services implementation, the implementing body will achieve the three characteristics of a Core European service**
- **In the long term, from a wide usage of the Deployment Guidelines an interoperable European road transport system will emerge. The deployment guidelines are cornerstones in European harmonisation.**



The use of Deployment Guidelines in EasyWay



The use of the Deployment Guidelines

- **The Deployment Guidelines will constitute a basic reference in the design and execution of EasyWay deployment activities**
- **Each guideline is adopted to fit the specific need of the service concerned. There is no standard format or content (although they are all based on a set of common instructions) as the European dimension of the services are very different to their nature**
- **Each Deployment Guideline will be combined with a “compliance check-list” for self-assessment within implementation activities**
- **The guidelines are agreed and intended for EasyWay usage. We will promote wider usage (following slides)**



Promotion of Deployment Guidelines in EasyWay



We benefit from wide application of the DG's

- **The EasyWay stakeholders have agreed to use the Deployment Guidelines as the basis for implementation activities within EasyWay**
- **Hence, it is not within the powers of the EasyWay partners to require application of the guidelines for implementations outside EasyWay**
- **However, it is clear that we will benefit from wide usage of the Deployment Guidelines also outside EasyWay**
- **Our goal is to ensure that the quality of the DG's is good enough to self-propel this process**
- **But we can assist with stimulation activities**



We shall promote wide application of the DG's

- **First of all by developing them to high quality documents that are valuable for stakeholders all over**
- **By providing easy access to the guidelines**
- **By collaboration with stakeholders outside EasyWay and inviting them into the process of developing the guidelines**
- **By giving the guidelines an attractive layout**
- **....a lot of work remains to be done in this process!**



EasyWay Deployment Guidelines Management



Our need: Continuous improvement

- **EasyWay needs to design and establish a management mechanism that ensure all stakeholders access to the required set of specifications and guidelines. There shall be a “one-stop-shop” for EasyWay Deployment Guidelines, known by everyone**
- **As Core Services evolve, also the Deployment Guidelines must be seen as evolutionary to safeguard (in particular in the beginning) that best practise is applied.**
- **There is at each moment only one valid set of Deployment Guidelines. Old versions are kept for reference.**
- **We have appointed specific “Guideline managers” for each of the guidelines to govern the revision process**



Validation of final EasyWay 1 version



What does it mean to validate the Deployment Guidelines?

- **There shall always be only one ruling set of Deployment Guidelines at each occasion**
- **By validating the guidelines, they replace the previous version as the basis for implementation guidance within EasyWay**
- **Future proposals for Guideline improvement shall be based on this version.**
